#### MEMORIES OF BAT & BALL

During August we have been helping local people to reminisce about their memories of Bat & Ball Station, St Johns area and train travel pre-1970's. We were delighted to host a reminiscence workshop with a group from Care UK who watched a presentation, looked at some artefacts and discussed going on holiday by train.

Oral history interviews with individuals were recorded in order to collect information, that would otherwise be lost, for future generations. These recordings will be transcribed in the autumn then archived at Sevenoaks Library along with photographs of the station restoration project. Thank you to all those involved so far.

#### DARENT VALLEY COMMUNITY RAIL PARTNERSHIP LAUNCH

Sunday 1<sup>st</sup> September was the launch of the new Darent Valley Community Rail Partnership (CRP). The aim of the CRP is to bring together 6 stations – Swanley, Eynsford, Shoreham, Otford, Bat & Ball and Sevenoaks - to promote local tourism, non-car transport and raise awareness of local heritage and culture under a distinctive brand.


## **FUTURE EVENTS**
